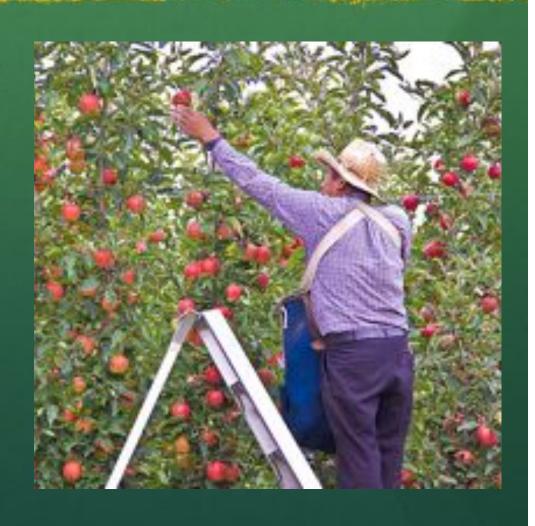
Orchard Picking and Pruning Machine

Problem

To effectively make a new design, several points need to be addressed:

- Leveling
- Picker Positioning
- Fruit bin management
- Transportation of fruit



Specifications

- Allows 1-2 picker to safely harvest fruit from height of 6-13 feet
- Is self-propelled and can work independent of a tractor
- Drives over and picks up fruit bins to minimize time dedicated to delivering fruit to the bin
- Includes leveling technology to allow use on grades up to 25 percent

Project Learning

 Current machines used in orchards were researched to find what parts of their design were useful



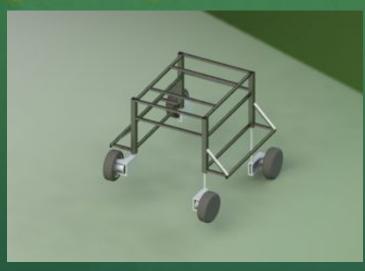








Frame/Leveling





- Leveling system similar to RVs
- Hydraulic pistons raise and lower each wheel
- Electric motor powers and turns each wheel

Platform



- Scissor lift raises and lowers picker
- Swinging arm accesses fruit in between trees

Testing of Scissor Lift





Bin Mechanism

- Located centrally in frame
- •Arms swing under bin
- Mechanism is raised by acme screws





Fan Assembly

- Fan rotates above bin for fruit dispersal
- Future fruit transport solution would feed fan



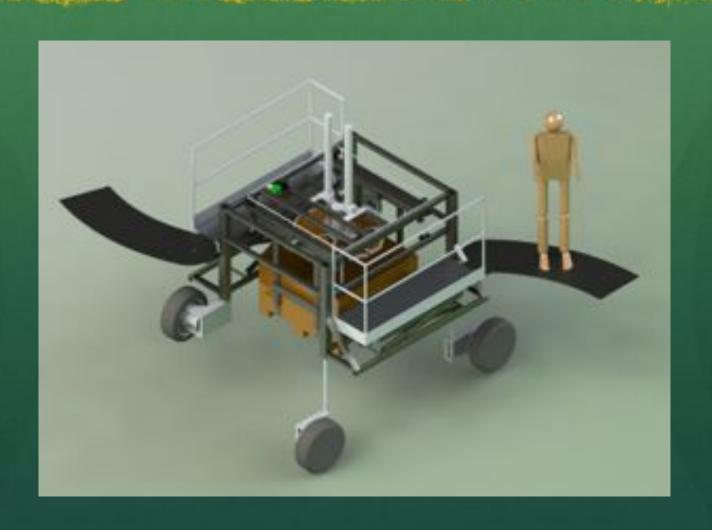
Working Prototype

Working prototype proved our design concepts with the following features:

- Hand cranked trailer jacks allow for bidirectional leveling
- Scaled down scissor lift provides vertical action
- Manual rendition of bin mechanism allows bin collection
